#### 2014/15 Draft Annual Plan

3 I attach a draft submission for further discussion and approval at the meeting.

#### **Liquor Bylaw**

- 4 I spoke at the Council meeting held on 27 March in Wanaka in support of the Board's request for the Council to undertake the review of the Liquor Bylaw before the end of the 2014 calendar year, so that any new provisions may be in place for implementation in summer 2014/15.
- 5 The Mayor advises that before 30 June 2014 consideration will be given to adding this project to the Chief Executive's work programme for 2014/15.

#### **Rumble Strips**

Infrastructure Services staff were supportive of the suggestion made at the last meeting that the installation of rumble strips across the carriageway would be an inexpensive but effective way of improving safety at the Riverbank Road/Ballantyne Road intersection. Funding has been allocated from existing budgets and the work will be undertaken at some stage during the period 28 April – 9 May 2014.

### **Duck Crossing Signage**

7 Members will observe that two signs have now been installed. As with the request for rumble strips, I wish to acknowledge the quick response from staff to these requests.

#### **Hawea School Track**

Submissions both supporting and opposing the proposed land swap for the development of the Hawea School Track were received, and the matter will now proceed to a public hearing. The hearing will take place on Monday 12 May at 10am in the supper room of the Lake Hawea Community Centre. The hearings panel (Councillors Lawton, MacLeod and Stamers-Smith) has the delegated authority to consider the submissions and make a recommendation on them to Council.

#### **Draft Wanaka Lakefront Reserves Management Plan**

9 The consultation period has been extended and submissions will now close on Friday, 6 June. This is because Section 41 of the Reserves Act 1977 stipulates that management plans shall be open for public comment for a period of not less than two months. It is proposed to hold the hearing on either 23 or 24 June.
