

I note that the main benefit put forward by the Council of such a convention centre would be to "attract a new type of visitor to Queenstown, providing additional economic benefits for the whole district.". Yet how precisely will this benefit Hawea? Or Wanaka for that matter? The Draft Annual Plan doesn't tell us. I am also saddened that yet another kiwi camp site is to bite the dust and be replaced by an enormous edifice which, even if the design is fantastic, will dominate the surrounds and reduce their charm. Most important of all, the "consultation" process lacked integrity to the point that I don't think it can be called such a thing. I was cold called to answer questions on the proposal. First of all, the questions were all multiple choice. They relied on a detailed understanding of the project, which I didn't have at that point. At no time do I remember having "I don't have enough information to answer this question" as a possible answer; and yet this was the case for most of my answers. For the duration of the survey, I felt very much on the back foot and confused. I certainly did not feel that I was given the opportunity to gain any understanding of the project, nor the chance to voice my actual opinions. A friend was also phoned up and had the same experience. The feeling I was left with following the phone call was that I had in no way been genuinely consulted and that the proposal was not a true proposal, but in fact a fait accompli.

The QLDC pools charge the full child's price for preschoolers.

On repeated occasions I have asked that the original Wanaka Sports Facility Operating Cost –Stage 1 Analysis, as contained in the Wanaka Progress Report & Business Case April 2012, page 14, be updated and confirmed. As far as I can determine there has been no additional detailed analysis as to the validity of the original revenue assumptions.



The original analysis projects income from facility patronage to be \$140,000, and a further \$25,000 from events, conferences trade shows, meetings.

What is a breakdown of the \$140,000???.

Who are the users and has their ability to pay been substantiated ???.

By way of example, in a previous submission, I noted that the largest user of the new indoor facility would likely be basketball. They currently pay around \$6000 to use the college gym. How much of the \$140,000 is basketball expected to pay if they use the new facility ???. Has this been discussed with Wanaka Basketball administrators ?? Can the teams and club afford the proposed charges.???

The projected annual operating loss of around \$850,000, assumes \$165,000 of user income. I have considerable doubts that this income level can be achieved.

Until a detailed analysis of the annual operating cost of the 3 Parks facility is completed (and confirmed as being reliable), I am unable to support the sports facility as recommended by the Steering Group.

If this analysis is not forthcoming, I support the idea of an additional gymnasium adjacent to the college as I believe the affordability and operating costs would be substantially lower.

Comments: The Queenstown Tennis Club Inc. would like to request a one off grant of \$15,000 (excl GST) in the Queenstown Lakes District Council 2014/15 Annual Plan as a contribution (25%) towards the resurfacing of the Tennis Club courts in the Queenstown Gardens. The cost of resurfacing the courts is approximately \$60,000 (based on 2 quotes) and would be made up of contributions from QLDC, The Central Lakes Trust, The Community Trust of Southland and Tennis Club Funds. Background The Queenstown Tennis Club has four (4) hard surface courts located in the Queenstown Gardens. The courts were last resurfaced in 2004 when the two (2) bottom courts were reconstructed from the base up, and the remaining two (2) tops courts resurfaced. The QLDC provided a \$60,000 grant, or almost 50% of the cost, towards these works. Other grants and club funds made up to the total of \$121,000 for the court refurbishment works. The Queenstown Tennis Club Inc. was established in the Queenstown Gardens 105 years ago, with the centenary held in 2009. The Tennis Club leases Queenstown Gardens land from the QLDC (current arrangement expires at the end of September 2031) and club rooms from the Queenstown Bowling Club. The QLDC grant in 2004 was the first time in living history that the Council was known to have contributed towards the Tennis Club. The 2004 Council funding was on the basis



that members of the public could use the courts and the public court hire fee was set at \$10. The public court hire fee has remained at \$10 since 2004. Members of the public are also able to hire rackets and join in on Club days for the same fee. This usually includes visiting New Zealanders and overseas tourists. The courts have been showing signs of increasing deterioration over the past 2 seasons and especially cracks appearing. The cracks are letting water into the courts and when freezing and thawing in winter is creating further cracking and surface irregularities in the courts. The surfacing manufacturer gives an estimated life of 6-7 years for the surfacing. The current court surfacing has lasted around 8 years before starting to show signs of loss of waterproofing and letting water into the underlying layers. The 10 year life is particularly good considering the harsh environment and temperature extremes that Queenstown experiences between seasons. So it is now prudent to resurface the courts to prevent further deterioration and restore the surface condition and water-proofing. Leaving the courts would result in further and increasing deterioration and the need to reconstruct the courts from the base up at significantly higher cost, estimated at \$60,000 per court, or \$240,000 in total. Financial The Tennis Club has approximately 120 senior members (2014), and approximately 150 juniors aged between 4 and 17 years old in the junior coaching programme. Much like the Queenstown Lakes District rating base, the Tennis Club has a limited base to raise funds through membership subscriptions while continuing to offer membership at a reasonable price for all members. The Tennis Club?s income is around \$25,000 annually, the majority of which comes from membership subscriptions, along with some additional income from fundraising events. After annual operating costs there is usually a small surplus, which goes into a bank account to fund future costs such as the court resurfacing. The Tennis Club currently has approximately \$23,000 in a term deposit account that will go towards the court resurfacing. The Tennis Club will also be seeking grants from the Central Lakes Trust and the Community Trust of Southland for the remaining shortfall in funding for the court resurfacing. The Tennis Club is run on a purely voluntary basis with the generosity of committee members and other club members in organising competitions and tournaments. Benefit to the Queenstown Community The Tennis Club provides organised tennis for both members and visitors to Queenstown with organised competitions on Saturdays and weekday twilight, along with midweek tennis and social tennis. The Tennis Club organises annual junior and senior Queenstown Open tournaments, along with fundraising tournaments, which brings people to Queenstown from outside the district, who utilises accommodation and restaurants while they are in town. Recent fundraising tournaments have benefited juniors with assistance for playing in national and overseas tournaments. Visiting players often comment on what beautiful setting the tennis club is in the Queenstown Gardens. The Tennis Club contributes to the social and physical health and wellbeing of the community by providing social interaction, especially for visitors and new people to town, and physical activity for health benefits. The tennis courts are used for grass roots peewee and junior coaching, with school holiday programmes, for approximately 150 juniors between the ages of 4 and 17 years old. The close proximity of the courts to Queenstown?s schools makes the courts ideal for after school coaching programmes, and the close proximity to the CBD is ideal for Queenstown visitors. The tennis courts in the gardens are also home to the Queenstown Tennis Academy. Under the leadership of former tennis professional and Wimbledon quarter finalist Lan Bale, promising youngsters from the area attend training sessions to prepare them for a possible future as a tennis professional. A number of past and present academy students hold national titles and recently one former student completed a university tennis scholarship in the United States, with four more currently on scholarships in the States and a



number of promising youngsters currently coming up through the academy. Two former students during their time the academy played at the Australian, French, Wimbledon and US Junior Opens and had tennis rankings well into the top 50 international juniors. The tennis club facilities also provide for general coaching and the Cardio Tennis programme. Tennis Club members make up the bulk of the Southern Lakes Tennis Team that competes in the Southern Quad Tournament with home and away matches against Otago, Southland, North Otago and South Canterbury. The Southern Lakes A Team has won the tournament consecutively for the past 12 years. Governance The Tennis Club is currently in the process of setting up the Southern Lakes Tennis Association (incorporating Queenstown Lakes and Central Otago clubs) to form an identity separate to the Otago & Southern Associations, provide the Southern Lakes area with its own identity and a voice at national level and maximise any benefits offered by Tennis NZ to the area such as national funding. With the Southern Lakes Association covering the Central Otago area this will also help strengthen the relationship with other tennis clubs in the area. 
The existing foreshore between the children's playground and the marina comprises a gently sloping grass bank that runs down to the lake edge. The bank features a number of willow trees and some native planting.

At present the Council is allowing and encouraging Lakeside Road to be a short cut and main thoroughfare for the traffic resulting from the extensive development which has occurred east of the lake as far out as Beacon Point. Not only has Lakeside Road become an extremely busy road, but it has become dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians attempting to use it. Traffic is exceeding the speed limit and regularly carrying out U turns when drivers realise they have gone the wrong way. Also, Lakeside Road is used by heavy trucks along with tourist buses, which stop to allow passengers to take photographs of the lake. Traffic using Lakeside Road joins Ardmore Street at the entry to the main area of the town by the lake front and this has already required an island to be installed. It has been described to us by locals at various times as being mayhem. This will only continue to become worse if the new apartment development takes place opposite the Marina. Attached is a copy of our letter to the Mayor dated 10 March 2014 which more fully expresses our concerns. On Thursday 24 April 2014 we met with Deputy Mayor Lyal Cocks and the Council's Chief Engineer, Ulrich Glasner and they



are very aware of our concerns and advised us to make this submission. We ask that you give our submission, that you reconfigure Lakeside Road, Wanaka into a neighbourhood and recreational road serious attention. This would divert the considerable amount of traffic presently using it to enter onto Ardmore Street, to a more appropriate entry point to that street, preferably further away from the lakeside and on the outskirts of the town. We look forward to receiving your response. Dear Mayor Vanessa Van Uden Lakeside Road - Wanaka We are the owners of a property in Lakeside Road, Wanaka. Lakeside Road is sadly rapidly becoming Wanaka's equivalent to Auckland's Tamaki Drive, which has successively required more and more traffic lights to control the increase in traffic flow and is dangerous for cyclists, several of whom have been killed by vehicles. In the more than ten years since we signed to purchase our property, the traffic flow and speed of traffic along Lakeside Road has increased dramatically. No thought or planning seems to have been put into dealing with the amount of additional traffic. The additional traffic that is now using Lakeside Road is partially due to the extensive development of the Beacon Point area. The Queenstown Lakes District Council has the opportunity to preserve the immediate foreshore of the lake for the benefit of walkers, runners and cyclists. When we originally purchased our property, we understood that Lakeside Road was to be closed off to through traffic past the marina, yet this has not happened. The traffic flow has now increased to a level that it has been necessary for the council to recently install a roundabout at its intersection with the main road, Ardmore Road, to control and assist the traffic flow. The intensive traffic is either turning into or from Lakeside Road into the main road in the centre of the town. During the Christmas break and on other occasions, the traffic is now often queued up from the roundabout back to the marina. A considerable number of vehicles commence down Lakeside Road then after a short distance, execute a three point turn and proceed back towards the town. Given the level of traffic floe, these manoeuvre are extremely dangerous. The council has also recently installed additional parking across the road from the Moorings Motel and in the process narrowed Lakeside Road further. From personal experience I have found it very dangerous for cyclists at that point and when forced to use the footpath as an alternative, cyclists face vocal objections and abuse from pedestrians also using the footpath. There is now a proposed development of 44 apartments to be built opposite the marina. We have been advised that the complex will be operating a rental pool with apartments configured so that each bedroom in the 3 bedroom apartments may be let separately to three different sets of guests. This will be equivalent to 132 hotel rooms each with at least one vehicle. This is an extra 132 vehicles adding to the level of traffic using Lakeside Road. We are advised that it is proposed that each apartment will have two car parks. Will this be sufficient? Please advise how the council, when considering the resource consent application for the development, intends to deal with: 1. The existing high level of traffic flow; 2. additional traffic flow as a result of the proposed development; 3. The demand for additional parking, when parking is already at a premium from Ardmore Road to the marina; 4. The additional pedestrian traffic to and from the Wanaka township to the development. We request that, as a consequence of the development, which we are assured by a representative of the developers, Infinity, will happen and from what is reported in the media, will be approved by the council, the following occur: 1. Lakeside Road is permanently closed past the marina and the extensive traffic be diverted onto Ardmore Road past the south side of the town; 2. Provision is made for substantially more parking in the development which will be required as a result of the configuration of the development; 3. Lakeside Road be made safer for cyclists and pedestrians. This would include an appropriate cycleway which our Prime Minister, Mr John Key, has



advocated for and provided for in other parts of the country. 4. The uniqueness of the road as a public facility along the lake side with its water feature, lake view walkway from the marina and cycle tracks be preserved. We would be happy to discuss this further with you or any member of the council who has the appropriate authority to make decisions in this respect. We ask that you give this letter serious consideration and look forward to receiving your response.

Comments: Tree Protection - 28 and 30 Cardigan Street Arrowtown (also adjacent site to west, Hertford Street) I own the above property that is within the Historic Zone at Arrowtown. There is a large Chamaecyparis lawsoniana (lawson's cypress) growing north of the north west corner of my house. This tree casts serious shade especially in the winter, was planted by my father, is well away from public views, and I request that is not be listed as a heritage tree when the list is compiled. I have concerns in regard to the scale and shading and nuisance (leaves in the gutters and deck) caused by the two large mountain beech trees (Nothofagus solandri var Cliffortioides) that flank the driveway entrance to the property on Hertford Street adjacent and to the west of 28 Cardigan Street. I request that these trees, which are beyond the scale needed to establish amenity, scale and sense of history, not be listed also. In summer from 4.00pm onwards, these trees take the sun from my site. The western "tree" is actually a cluster of trees, likely at some stage to fall apart. I have concerns also with the large trunk on the eastern tree which leans towards my dwelling and would do a lot of damage were it to break. Tree Protection - 31 Caernarvon Street, Arrowtown I own the above property that is within Arrowtown's historic zone, a 505m2 site. There is a large walnut tree well over one hundred years old on my section by the



north east boundary. I am fine with this tree being a listed, heritage tree. There is also a large Cedrus deodar. Himalayan cedar (it may be a lebanon cedar but I believe not) on my property close to the Caernarvon Street boundary which I grew from a seed in my childhood. This tree is now becoming very large but will grow still more and outgrow the site. My site is too small to include this as a heritage tree and I request the cedar is not listed. My neighbour, the Sideys to the south, (also on Denbigh St - Caernarvon Street) corner and my neighbours at 33 Caernarvon St (to the east) - Alan and Nan Butcher - have requested I remove the cedar. I request that it not be listed, it is an inappropriate species for a small suburban residential site.

Council reports have also failed to take into account that when a big conference of 750 people book out hotel rooms that's 750 people less in town spending money on other things (when town is full or close to it). Ring around now and try to find 425 rooms at hotels for the next three nights (a conference average of 1.75 pax per room). You wouldn't find them and when a conference starts for example on a Wednesday all flights on a Tuesday into town will be booked out - so any FIT travelers or regular bus tour groups just simply wont book flights or accommodation when a big conference is here. Undoubtedly there would be some benefit to the town but not anywhere near as much as these mis-guided "official reports" would have us believe - 450 full time equivalent jobs and benefit to the town of \$20-30 million p.a (that's more than \$70,000 per day - every single day of the year) are figures that have to be seriously questioned. Council's "Scuttlebutt" magazine says the centre would not break even in the first five years (and doesn't say anything about after that) and yet the Howarth HTL council funded report says it will break even in it's 3rd year. They cant even get basic points like this to match. Any survey company can come up with reports the client (Council) wants to see but it doesn't make them true. We should run a mile away from this proposal while we still can or the ratepayers of the Wakatipu will be paying for it forever.

As such, I also oppose QLDC making capital or recurrent contributions for the Centre from residents? rates. Main Reasons ?The proposal is presented as a facility for conventions. There are parenthetic add-ons for weddings, exhibitions, and concerts. The financial analysis has not included potential revenues and costs for these add-on activities. ? The facility would serve primarily the region?s commercial sector and not the interests of most residents. For many residents the ?benefit? would be negative, with more congestion on our roads to and through



Queenstown, and more pressures on parking. Resident ratepayers should not be assessed for negative benefits. ? The economics of the proposed Centre, necessitating both a capital contribution and recurrent subsidies from QLDC (for five years?), are incomplete and not persuasive. ? After several discussions with private parties, e.g. Sky City Entertainment, none has agreed to participate in the development. Clearly, the financial risks to the project are substantial. ? No information is provided on the counterfactual, i.e. the annual net income to QLDC from the Lakeview site in its current use. Nor is information provided on QLDC?s projected financial return to its proposed capital investment, including the value of the land (to enable a comparative analysis). ? No Terms of Reference are included in the consultants? prior or current reports. We are unable to assess whether the consultants were preempted from pursuing a broader analysis and therefore whether QLDC predetermined the key outcomes. ? The facility at 750 maximum capacity is too small. As a community facility it should provide preferably for 1,200 and certainly no less than 1,000 persons. Alternatively I would support a proposal for a dual-purpose facility that caters to (a) strengthening the community?s arts and entertainment activities, and (b) hosting conventions. Such a facility should support the two activities equally. Reflecting its dual purpose, it should be called the ?Entertainment & Convention Centre? or ?Convention & Entertainment Centre?. The arts and entertainment component for the visual and performing arts?would require a dedicated design, including appropriate acoustics and theatre infrastructure. The facility thus would serve the interests of the broader Wakatipu community. In that event, I would have no objection to QLDC contributing limited capital and/or a time-bound recurrent subsidy to the facility. Financial Analysis By including arts and entertainment in a dual-purpose facility, as proposed above, the financial analysis would have to be reworked. The additional revenues generated may render the Center less dependent on QLDC financial support. The consultants should be asked to rework their analysis accordingly. It should include a comparison of the financial returns to QLDC from (a) the Convention Centre proposal, including dual-purpose use, and (b) the net income generated from the site?s current use as rental housing for low-income residents. [Note: expanding low-income housing on the site may be a financially viable option for QLDC.] Economic Growth (GDP) A key justification for recommending development of a Convention Centre is its purported contribution to the district?s economic growth (local GDP). No consideration has been given to GDP per capita, a widely held proxy for our standard of living and prosperity. GDP is a value-added concept that can be measured by expenditures on final goods and services. By definition, final expenditures on constructing and operating the proposed Convention Centre, and expenditures by more tourists and residents, would increase our community?s GDP. But in as much as the percentage increase in the numbers of tourists and residents were greater than the increase in real GDP, our community would be, on average, worse off. More is not necessarily better. Our region?s median family income may decline as a consequence of developing a Convention Centre. Public Consultation Council documents report the results of an independent survey, in 2013, that 54.8% of residents supported the proposal that Council should lead the development of a Convention Centre. The survey question, however, was loaded in that it presumed the Council had decided a priori to proceed with the facility. The primary concern of residents was, and remains, whether the Council should support a Convention Centre with ratepayer funding, period, not whether the Council, as opposed to some other entity, should lead the development of it. From the preemptive way the question was framed, the Council could not conclude whether residents agreed or disagreed that the Council should proceed with the project. In my view, the consultation was misleading. It did



not comply with a statutory principle (Local Government Act, Section 78) ? A local authority must, in the course of its decision-making process in relation to a matter, give consideration to the views and preferences of persons likely to be affected by, or to have an interest in, the matter. The community should be consulted in a transparent manner. Summarizing I am opposed to the use of residents? rates to develop a Convention Center as currently proposed by the Council. It is clear from the Council documents that the financial risks to the project, and to ratepayers, are considerable. Only if the Council can demonstrate that a facility would generate net benefits tangible and intangible to our community at large, rather than primarily to commercial interests, could expenditure of residents? rates be justified. In my view, the intangible benefits to our community of a dual-purpose facility are substantial. I would support a contribution from residents? rates for such a facility. Notwithstanding the considerable work and publicity carried out by the Council thus far, the Council should ask the consultants to rework their analysis to include the costs and benefits of a dual-purpose approach. The community should then be consulted accordingly.





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Coastguard Queenstown thanks the Council for the opportunity to make this submission and for the support already offered to this project.

This submission is a request to have the loan of \$50,000 offered to Coastguard Queenstown by the Council transferred to a grant offer.

The cost of the new operations base beside the lake is \$575,086. We have already raised 68% of the money we need.

This submission is based on the following key points:

- Coastguard is New Zealand's primary marine search and rescue organisation operating around the coast and on our major inland waterways.
- Coastguard is a charity and receives only 13% of its funding from central government. All search and rescue operations are undertaken by trained Coastguard volunteers.
- 3. Coastguard Queenstown is made up of 19 active volunteer crew members who last year:
- Gave 2,185 hours of service to our community.
- Responded to 3 calls for help from members of the public.
- Responded to 4 Police initiated emergency call outs.
- Rescued 8 people and made sure they returned home safely to their families or transported them to medical treatment.
- 4. Queenstown has a resident population of about 18,000 and welcomes more than 100 times that number in visitors per year. The result is more people recreationally using the lake whether boating, kite surfing, fishing, kayaking, paddle boating, swimming, diving, snorkelling etc. There is also a need for people who do not intend to fall into the water but still require an efficient marine search and rescue service.
- 5. Coastguard Queenstown has been operating for almost 6 years since incorporating on 18 September 2007. Coastguard Queenstown is a registered charity.

- 6. Coastguard Queenstown since its inception has based its operations in privately owned buildings and more recently has rented a small area in the back room of the Scouts Hall at Frankton Marina (approximately 3m x 2 m). This space was not designed to meet the needs of a marine search and rescue service but it was the only convenient and available property with close access to the Frankton Marina, where the Coastguard launches its boat, Queenstown Airport Rescue 1.
- 7. The small area in the Scouts Hall is not large enough to store
- bulky wet crew clothing,
- clothing racks to dry wet weather gear,
- crew grab bags,
- other equipment for the boat, including stand alone generators to cover loss of power and supplies.
- 8. There is also the need for an ablution area (toilets and showers) for a control communications room, a larger dedicated training room with screens and a projector, an office area and kitchenette. This has become a significant issue for Coastguard Queenstown particularly in light of the growth in the number of volunteers.
- 9. Visitor numbers to the region have steadily climbed and in turn the increased use of the lake means there is an even higher need for the Coastguard service.
- 10. Coastguard Queenstown was established in response to recognised community need for marine search and rescue services. In 2011, Trust Power and local Councillors recognised the special contribution and services Coastguard Queenstown provides when it awarded Runner Up in the Sports and Leisure category, a significant and well deserved achievement.

We are asking you as our community's leaders to support Coastguard Queenstown volunteers and make sure they have a fit-for-purpose base to operate from.

BACKGROUND

Coastguard Queenstown is run by volunteers.

Every hour of the day, every day of the year, they are ready to respond to a call for help.

Queenstown is an active and vibrant community of around 18,000 residents, who welcome more than 100 times the resident population in visitors every year. Our community is geographically surrounded by dramatic mountains, rivers and Lake Wakatipu. The Lake is long, deep and cold. When a storm brews, it is a very dangerous place to be.

More and more people are using the lake. They boat, sail, windsurf, kite surf, fish, kayak, paddle boat, swim, dive and snorkel in and on it.

Over the years locals and visitors alike have come to grief on the lake. Local families and those in far off countries have had to deal with the grief of losing a loved one.

In 2007 Queenstown local man Jay Berriman recognised the need for a volunteer on water search and rescue service and decided to do something

about it. Jay had grown up admiring the Royal National Lifeboat Institute (RNLI) in the UK. He knew the difference a group of dedicated and trained volunteers could make. Jay brought together a group of like-minded boating people together and Coastguard Queenstown was born.

Since those early days Coastguard Queenstown volunteers have worked hard to raise funds needed for equipment and to train. It is now a highly skilled and well equipped group who are ready to respond to emergencies on the water. They just need a base for search and rescue operations, a place to store and dry wet weather gear, and a place to train and educate the boating public.



PROJECT SUMMARY

A suitable space

Coastguard Queenstown's 19 active volunteer crew have been making-do since the Unit formed in 2007. Over those six years local Coastguard volunteers have given 16,829 hours of service to our community. They have rescued 139 people and brought them safely home to their loved ones. It is now time for our community to support these dedicated volunteers by helping them build a modest but practical space to work from. The proposed building will house storage and workshop space downstairs and an operations room and administration area upstairs. The operations room will also be used for both volunteer and public training.

Search and Rescue (SAR) Operations Base

The new facility will include fit-for-purpose operations room that will be set up with radio and computer equipment to support search and rescue operations including aircraft down on water. During an incident the Police could manage the operation from this purpose designed space utilising technology to monitor the search and rescue vessel, plot and plan search areas, and

communicate with all volunteers involved in the operation. Coastguard volunteers would also use this equipment when responding to calls for help from members of the public.

Training


The operations room would also be used for Coastguard volunteer training, here volunteers would have the opportunity to create search and rescue exercises using the equipment that would be used in a real emergency as well as regular Coastguard training modules. The space would also be used to deliver public safe boating education classes.

Secure Gear Storage

Downstairs is a gear storage area. Here all Coastguard search and rescue equipment would be housed including the wet weather gear used by volunteers. There will be space for wet mullion suits and boots to be dried and stored ready for the next

time they are needed, plus towels, blankets and so on used on the boat in training or SAR. There will also be space for volunteer crew to store their clothing while out on the boat.

OUR RESPONSE

Search and Rescue Operations

Coastguard is tasked to respond to distress calls by Police and Maritime New Zealand's Rescue Coordination Centre. Coastguard also responds to calls for assistance from members of the public.

In the 12 months ended 30 June 2013 Coastguard Queenstown volunteers responded to 3 calls for assistance, 4 Police call outs and rescued 8 people. Our volunteers gave a total of 2,185 hours in service to the community.

Teamwork & Collaboration

Depending on the nature of the incident and location Coastguard resources often work together with other marine search and rescue agencies such as the Westpac Rescue Helicopter, St John, Fire, Surf Lifesaving, Rescue Co-ordination Centre, Maritime New Zealand and the Police.

This collaboration can be critical as often helicopters can reach casualties more quickly further out to sea and carry a paramedic on board, where as rescue vessels can stay out at sea for longer, carry more patients, tow boats and launch quickly to local incidents.

Rescues can rely on the teamwork of Coastguard volunteers and other rescue agencies. Training exercises are organised so that volunteer crews gain experience working with other agencies.

Prevention Coastguard's NowCasting

Coastguard's NowCasting Service has coverage around New Zealand and provides a continuous weather forecast of vital, up-to-the minute safety information for boaties planning to go to sea. NowCasting information includes the peak and average wind speed, wind direction, as well as the next high tide information and most recent marine forecast. It can be accessed using marine VHF radio.

Education

Boating education courses provide members of the public with the skills and knowledge they need to safely participate in boating activities. Coastguard Boating Education courses are recommended for all boaties covering beginner levels through to more advanced learning opportunities. Courses are provided in both a classroom type situation at a local venue and as home study packs enabling students to learn at home.



PROJECT PLAN

To meet the needs of the community, Coastguard Queenstown's vision is to build a new Operations Centre and in time, an adjoining boat ramp.

Coastguard Queenstown developed specifications for the new centre and ramp showing the area to be built upon and outlining their expectations and the scope of use for the new centre.

Discussions and site visits with the local Council representative; Joanne Conroy of APL Property Limited were then initiated, together with the instruction of lan Adamson and Hilton Miller of Warren & Mahoney in Queenstown as Architects to prepare the requisite concept and construction drawings and specifications. They have also been instructed to prepare the relevant tender and appointment documents for the builder; and will be overseeing the project as outlined further below.

- Tim Bradford of Lewis Bradford Consulting Ltd has been instructed as structural engineer.
- Wilson Contracting have been instructed to install services to the site, this work was completed at the end of last year.
- Aurum Surveyors have been instructed to survey the leasehold land.
- Tonkin and Taylor were instructed to undertake and provide necessary geotech assessments and repair.
- Cosgroves have been retained as Fire Engineer.
- Scott Freeman has been retained as Planner.
- Graeme Todd is working as Planning Lawyer.

The application for a lease to occupy the Council Reserve land at the Frankton Marina (for the standard period of 33 years for a peppercorn rental of \$1 per year) has been granted. The lease commenced on the 1st of July 2012.

Coastguard Queenstown has consulted with the Wakatipu Preservation Society Trust and the Scouts who occupy adjacent land at the Frankton Marina, both of whom have given their unanimous support to the Coastguard's project.

A construction sub-committee comprised of Coastguard Queenstown Board members was established last year:

Coastguard Queenstown will have complete ownership of the Operations Centre which will be sited upon Council reserve land and is leased to Coastguard Queenstown for a period of 33 years. There is the opportunity for a further 33 years.

We went to tender in October last year and received three tenders from local building firms. In conjunction with Warren and Mahoney, negotiations were entered into, as a result a preferred tenderer was selected. These tender prices are reflected in our project budget. These prices have been held for us in the short term whilst we fundraise the balance.



Comments: QLDC Sewerage Plant Submission We would like to propose that the council make provision to investigate a proposal to take over ownership and control of the private sewerage treatment plant located on the Luggate Village subdivision, with a view to providing a cost effective sewerage disposal system accessible by the whole community. We would like to see provision made for funding for due diligence investigations and any possible modifications the council would require to run the system efficiently. The reason we wish this to be considered is that the plant had been previously offered to the council who at the time said they would consider acceptance when the subdivision reached 50% development. This has now been exceeded. As the plant has no asset value on LVSL?s books the transfer would properly take the form of a gifting. We feel the provision of reticulated sewerage should be a function of the local council, and that the council?s staff have the expertise in the administration of sewerage systems which we don?t have. It is a situation we have inherited from the developer, and one we feel is more properly placed to be under the governance of the wider council. The current situation is cumbersome and inconvenient to both the management of LVSLtd. and its shareholders who have to pay separate bills to both council and Luggate Village Services Ltd. for their sewage disposal. Furthermore, we



feel the current situation is not in the best interests of the community as the ?old? township outside of the subdivision is excluded. We would suggest for Luggate to grow and have access to modern services it is essential for the health and wellbeing of the community to have access to a reticulated sewerage system which serves the whole township. We believe the Plant has the capability to comfortably serve the larger town. In order to progress negotiations with council LVSLtd. took a vote on the matter at its recent shareholders? AGM, Saturday 10 May. Request: That a wheelie bin rubbish collection be started for the Wanaka Ward Residents.

<u>Reason:</u> Currently the recyclables collected in Wanaka only makes up 33% of the total waste/recyclables of the ward. (See *Wanaka Sun* Wastebusters article attached).

Recycling has been carried out in the district for 14-15 years and the pipe dream of 100% recycling seem just as far away as it was when recycling started. It will be another 14-15 to achieve if ever at all.

In the Wanaka Ward a fully equipped truck collects those wheelie bins paid for privately by house holders so the only additional expense for a wheelie bin service is the one off supply of the bins. The collection of the rubbish should be cheaper than the service currently operated as a driver only would be required as no runners would be needed to throw bags as is the case at the moment.

Our household currently pays the \$147.00 council waste management charge and \$115 being half the cost of a commercial wheelie bin service which is shared with a neighbour. A properly organised district wide Council service would cost somewhere around the same.

In the media residents complain of bags being ripped open and rubbish being spread around the streets, and it has long been recognised that wheelie bins store waste in the most hygienic manner whilst awaiting collection.

To suggest that householders would cease to recycle if a wheelie bin service is started is nonsense but a more likely side effect would be that rubbish currently abandoned on open ground would stop.

We compost our organic waste to the garden and fully utilise the recycling collection within its limitations but still end up with rubbish for the waste collection, until those in the recycling area can find a use for that waste, a proper wheelie bin service is the only viable alternative. Please allocate funding in 2014-2015 financial year for this service to remove the other 67% of the district's waste not catered for within the rating system.

nubbish collection, only arecycling collection - that's pretty radical! Innovative Waste Kaikoura also runs the tip, so they can stop

wool-sac, and that it's free to recycle scrap metal. Unloading only takes a minute with staff to help. If we can recycle more, that pesky diversion rate will shift upwards to know that it only costs \$5 to recycle the amount of cardboard that would fit in a

<u>Reason:</u> This footpath was to be built in the 2012-2013 Financial Year but when it was time to start this project there were insufficient funds left to complete this path. As a **temporary** solution the Albert Town Community Association agreed to have a gravel surfaced path constructed for use of the residents and funding allocated in the next year to complete the project. The Association did not give its approval for the gravel surface as a permanent solution and never would have agreed to such a plan.

Kingston Street is the oldest street in the Wanaka Ward and if the Norman Family records are correct it is the oldest in the QLDC. It is an insult to the Residents (and Ratepayers) of Kingston Street that they do not enjoy the facilities of those in the much newer parts of Albert Town. The ongoing infrastructure department restructures are misguided and failing the ratepayer, making short term gains only, 0 rates increase this year but at the cost of burdening the future ratepayer beyond belief. Queenstown mountain bike club submission on the QLDC draft annual plan 2014-15

This submission will focus on the mountain bike (MTB) aspect in Queenstown of the plan which is summarized in the QLDC draft plan as follows:

'Mountain biking

The success of downhill and cross country mountain biking has been huge and continues to grow district-wide. The Council is committed to work with operators such as Skyline, the Upper Clutha and Wakatipu Trails Trusts and clubs to maintain and enhance these trails across the district. This is an exciting new industry already having an impact in terms of visitor numbers and international exposure. The Council supports this growing recreation opportunity.'

Queenstown has become the mountain biking epicentre of New Zealand and the Southern Hemisphere. International media showcasing Queenstown mountain biking trails is attracting riders from all over the world at a prolific rate.

QMTBC is the heart and soul behind the majority of these trails, developing and maintaining them to a world class standard as a volunteer ran community group with over 750 members.



About the Queenstown Mountain Bike Club

The Queenstown Mountain Blke Club has worked with local land managers since 2003 to develop the riding areas that has made the Queenstown MTB scene famous and helped boost local economy.

The QMTBC has over 750 active members making it the largest volunteer club in the Wakatipu.

These areas include:

- △ Gorge Road Jump Park and pump track 30+ jumps from beginner to expert
- △ 7mile Cross Country Bike Park 30km + of purpose built singletrack
- △ Wynyard Terrain Park and Express downhill 20+ jumps from beginner to expert plus 2km downhill trail
- △ Jardine's Park family loops and pump tracks 3km easy family trails and 2 pump tracks
- ▲ B.o.B grade 3 cross country trail
- △ Gold Digger grade 3 cross country trail
- A Rude Rock grade 4 cross country trail
- △ Phoenix grade 3 cross country trail
- A Pack Track and Sack grade 5 cross country trail
- △ G.S.D grade 6 downhill trail in the Queenstown Bike Park

The Queenstown Mountain Bike Club (QMTBC) was formed in 2003 by a group riders with a vision...To develop Queenstown into a world renowned biking destination.

10 years on and that vision has become a reality.

Take a look at any major international biking website or magazine and there will be an article or video showcasing the Queenstown scene and will have riders from all over the world planning their next MTB holiday to the Southern Hemisphere's premier riding destination.

These articles and videos that are going viral within the online and print MTB world would not be possible without the trails and riding areas that the QMTBC have developed.

These trails and areas encapsulate a wide range of riding styles including downhill, cross country, jump park and family orientated trails. They are enjoyed by all members of the community, young and old, beginner to experienced. The club, or it's members do not reserve the right to use any of these areas. They are all free to use and the club does not gain any revenue from these areas besides the odd fundraising event to cover some maintenance costs.

These trails and riding areas are community owned facilities developed by a dedicated group of the community for the community.

The biking community is no longer a minority group with more and more locals and tourists mountain biking in the area.

The club also works with other interested parties such as:

- A Queenstown Bike Park Working with QLDC, Skyline and other interested parties to formulate a sustainable way to manage to the Bike Park to it's full potential using what limited resources are available. This has become a great asset to Queenstown and the club will continue to work with other parties to ensure the ongoing management and development of the trails within the park.
- A Consulting with local land owners who wish to develop MTB opportunities on private land
- △ Consulting with other clubs in NZ
- ▲ Local bike shops
- ▲ Department of Conservation
- △ Local businesses who would like to attract mountain biking clientele.

The club is a non-profit organization and is entirely ran by volunteers. The club has raised funds and secured trust funding for the construction of some of these areas.

All work prior to construction is carried out free of charge. This work can add up to some serious hours with committee members often taking time off from their full time jobs to complete. These duties include:

- A Meeting with a wide range of organizations such as DoC, QLDC, HPT and funding bodies to discuss proposals or consult on various matters.
- △ Trail 'scoping' (wandering around getting scratched in the forest!)
- ▲ Trail/area design
- △ Drawing up and submitting proposals and trail descriptions
- △ Walking trails with archaeologists and HPT when applicable
- A Preparing and applying for funding
- [▲] Preparing submissions

Events

As mentioned before the club holds fundraising events using the areas to raise money to pay for the maintenance costs associated with the high usage the areas receive.

These events provide affordable social and recreation opportunities for the public to enjoy. Often attracting professional international competitors to ride alongside locals and impress the spectators. The media coverage from these events often appear on international websites and inspire riders from all over the world to put Queenstown on their 'wish list' and word spreads quickly throughout the northern hemisphere as they wait for the snow to melt so they can get on their bikes again. More and more international riders are choosing Queenstown as a way to escape the winter in the northern hemisphere and coming to live here for the MTB season much like a winter ski seasonnaire.

All of these events are put on entirely by volunteers of the QMTBC committee and it's membership.

There are many other events based around the MTB scene, just this past year Queenstown has played host to the National Downhill Series, NZ Cyclocross champs and the Queenstown Bike Festival. All of the events have brought riders from all over NZ, Australia and even further afield. Particularly the Queenstown Bike Festival, a 10 day celebration of cycling encapsulating all types of riding from kids fun rides to the Teva slope-style which attracted a crowd of approximately 6000 and had many people commenting that it was the best ever event in Queenstown. The Teva Slopestyle is a silver level event in The FMB (freeride mountain bike) world tour.

The Super D, Tour de Wakatipu and downhill races were all sold out and attracted a huge out of town following with over 80% of competitors in the Super D coming form outside of the Queenstown region. The festival also played host to many social activities such as social family rides, a 16" bike race around a local bar and a film festival. All hugely popular and providing locals and visitors with healthy, affordable entertainment.

Events like these could not be held without the trails and riding areas that make the Queenstown scene so popular. The areas that the club has developed and managed over the years and are now struggling to maintain due to the high numbers of locals and tourists that are using them. The club would like to see money coming back to the trails from these events.

Some events are charged a levy by APL for use of the areas where the trails lie. Currently the revenue generated by this levy does not get filtered back to the area where it was gained from. The club would like to see all revenue from an event held on a MTB trail/area be put directly back into it's source.

These events and riding areas bring thousands of mountain bike tourists to Queenstown who stay in local accommodation, eat out at restaurants and pump much needed dollars into the local economy. The Queenstown Bike Festival itself brings in over \$2million to the area in just 10 days. Imagine what bikes are bringing in over the whole year!

The inclusion of Mountain Biking as a 'must do activity' in the 2013 Lonely Planet is a guarantee that riders will be coming in large numbers to sample the trails and areas that Queenstown has to offer. As a community we must ensure that Queenstown does not disappoint. As Queenstown is notorious for it's adrenaline activities the type of riding the Lonely Planet reader will be more exciting than a 'rail trail' style track. They want singletrack and jumps.

QMTBC Accomplishments 2012-13

- △ Construction of 'Gold Digger'. A 2.5km grade 3 dual direction cross country singletrack trail through gold mining remains in 7mile creek. This serves as fun alternative to the sealed Moke Lake Road and links to other trails in the area.
- △ Construction of 'Rude Rock'. A 3km grade 4 downhill cross country trail from Coronet Peak to Skippers saddle area.
- A High standard of maintenance to QMTBC's existing areas. A combination of volunteers and expert contractors paid for by the QMTBC through fundraising.
- ▲ Wednesday night volunteer digs Now in our second year our volunteer trail-building program is going exceptionally well. Every wednesday evening club members work on a new trail or maintain and existing one. Projects completed in 2012-13 include work on Gold Digger,

- maintenance on the dual use Moonlight Track, maintenance on Rude Rock, BoB and construction of a 1.5km link track from Rude Rock to the Skippers Pack Track.
- A Pilot Adopt-A-Trail program where local businesses carry out the basic maintenance of a chosen trail. R and R sports have been working on Gold Digger with great results. The club looks to expand this program for 2013-14.
- A Queenstown DH series A fun community based downhill race series was born from huge demand from local riders. The series was ran by volunteers and was a great success. The funds raised will go towards a timing system for future events.
- A Red Bull roast it BMX event. One of Queenstown's best events featuring the world best riders.
- A Fundraising throughout Queenstown Bike Festival
- △ Design and sales of QMTBC merchandise including T-shirts, hats and calendars to raise funds for trail development and management.

- Continue Wednesday night volunteer digs to maintain and build new trails all over the Wakatipu.

- A flagship all around event encompassing all styles of mountain biking.
- A Organise and lead a new volunteer built downhill track in the Queenstown Bike Park.

- Construction of 'Phoenix'. A grade 3 walking and biking cross country trail linking the Lake Dispute track and Wilsons Bay avoiding dangerous 100kmh road section. Built by contractors.
- Construction of 'Pack Track and Sack.' A grade 5 handbuilt link from Rude Rock to the Skippers pack track. Built by volunteers on the Wednesday night crew with a total of 1005 volunteer hours.
- Construction of 'G.S.D.' A grade 6 downhill trail in the Queenstown Bike Park. Built by volunteers with a total of 750 volunteer hours.
- Construction of a re-route of the climb from Wilson's Bay in the 7mile reserve. Built by contractors.
- Wednesday night digs Construction of Pack Track and Sack and maintenance of existing tracks including dual use tracks such as Arawata Terrace track. The Wednesday dig crew have contributed a total of 3060.5 hours (at the time of writing). If this was charged at \$20 per hour then it would total \$61,210 of free community input.

- Continuation of the Queenstown DH series. Now in it's second year the series is incredibly popular with locals and visiting riders including some of the worlds top pro riders.

- Working through permission to take over the management of Fernhill Loop track and maintain and enhance for the walking and biking community.

 maintenance and other companies actively volunteer time to maintain trails.

Facts and figures 2012-13

Due to the huge popularity of mountain biking in Queenstown both from locals and tourists QMTBC's riding areas have had a significant amount of use year round.

Below is a table with usage estimates for all club areas and general single-track XC trails (not QT Trail) based on an average day calculated by recorded observations by QMTBC committee members over the 2012-13 year.

Note, figures are for individual uses of trails in the areas. for example one run of a jump line at Gorge Road where users will complete an average of 30 and up to 100 runs per session. At an average ride at 7mile Bike park users will ride 6 trails.

Some areas are open 365 days a year and some only 6 months due to conditions (snow etc).

The Gorge Road jump park has a core crew that maintains the park to an extremely high standard and put in approximately 50 hours per week voluntarily.

The QMTBC wednesday night volunteers are out every week rain or shine, light or dark building and maintaining trails in the region.

Total labour hours donated by the volunteers to date is 3060.5. If this was charged at a rate of \$20 per hour it would be valued at \$61,210!

This does not include work done by other volunteer crews working at the jump parks or downhill trails. The digs are a great way for members of the community to meet new friends, keep fit and make a difference to the local riding scene.

The QMTBC would like to acknowledge the work done by the Queenstown Trails Trust on the Queenstown Trail. This is a great asset to the community and provides a great way for family's and beginner riders to enjoy our fantastic area.

However we must clarify that we do **not** classify this as cross country (XC) mountain bike riding. These wide gravel trails are great for relaxing rides and commuting to different areas but they lack the adrenaline that mountain bikers seek. The trails that mountain bikers enjoy are narrower (less than 1m), more natural and generally gain and lose more elevation.

The draft plans reads as follows:

△ Over 150km of walkways, tracks and mountain bike trails.

Of the 150km approximately 10-15km are actual mountain bike trails. The majority of these are in the Queenstown Bike Park primarily accessed by the Skyline Gondola. QLDC provide \$20,000 toward the maintenance of these trails which the club supports. However as these trails are the only ones in the area with a direct financial input (Skyline lift ticket sales) the club would like to see the revenue go back to the trails and QLDC support other trails in the area that are free for the locals and tourists to use.

The other trails are the Queenstown Trail and walking tracks which receive approximately \$130,000 for the maintenance. These trails are important to the community but it appears that the funding is not proportionate to the usage.

Take a look around town and you see bikes everywhere. There is no denying that bikes are having an economic impact to the whole community. This would not happen without the trails that the QMTBC and other volunteers have built and maintain. For the experienced eye it is clear that the majority of these bikes are mountain bikes, either downhill, cross country, enduro or jump bikes. Bikes that are used to ride on real mountain biking singletrack trails. The same trails that appear in countless internet video

edits that showcase Queenstown to the world as a 'mecca' for mountain biking to visit in their winter time.

Recent DoC Studies show that visitors are coming to Queenstown specifically to mountain bike in the Queenstown Bike Park and QMTBC trails and know of their existence before arriving. However most visitors who use the Queenstown trail only learn of it when they arrive and it is not a determining factor in their visit as the mountain bike trails are.

Media

Queenstown Mountain Biking practically markets itself. International athletes and journalists travel from all over the world to ride and document Queenstown's mountain bike trails. The club does not engage anyone to promote the area yet throughout the summer there is a constant feed of articles hitting the websites, magazines and other avenues.

Development

QMTBC have very exciting plans to fill in the one remaining gap in the Queenstown biking spectrum. Backcountry singletrack.

We have the Queenstown trail for grade 1-2 family riding, 7mile for short XC rides, Gorge road and Wynyard for free-riders and the Queenstown Bike Park for the downhill riders but very few options for a rider seeking a long cross country singletrack ride. Please see the attached XC network proposal for more details.

These cross country riders are going to have the greatest economic impact for the area as they generally high on the socio economic scale and will be coming to Queenstown for XC riding much like a skier visiting for a ski holiday.

The QMTBC would like QLDC to help develop this network alongside the club to honestly label Queenstown as the Southern Hemisphere's premier riding destination. These trails are relatively cheap in comparison to a grade 1-2 cycleway and offer very good value per user as well as attracting a desirable tourist group to the area and are generally usable year round including shoulder seasons.

As you can see on the network proposal there are many options for QLDC to get involved in this exciting opportunity and the club are happy to discuss the best way to move forward. The Department of Conservation are looking to take on the network as their cycling strategy in the near future and have expressed an interest in joining forces with QLDC, QMTBC and the Queenstown Trails Trust to make this network a reality.

The club would also like to work with QLDC on re-opening the local favourite Fernhill Loop. Please see attached proposal that is in the application process now. We aim to ensure the current trail is safe and signposted well and construct new handbuilt trails to improve user experience.

The QMTBC would like to apply for part funding for the construction of this trail. Estimated costs have to be confirmed by a contractors but QMTBC would like to apply for \$10,000 contribution from QLDC for this 2-3km trail. QMTBC will cover the rest of the cost through our own finances or fundraising from other parties and will cover the cost of annual maintenance For all proposed trails please see the QMTBC XC network proposal.

Ideally a partnership will be formed with QMTBC, QLDC, QTT and DoC in the near future to start the wheels turning (excuse the pun!).

QMTBC are also looking to employ a part time secretary position to carry out admin work to relieve some of the workload currently carried out by volunteers as mountain biking has outgrown the capacity of a small volunteer group. The estimated budget is \$15,000.

Summary

As outlined in this document and stated in the draft plan Mountain Biking is experiencing substantial growth and is showing no signs of slowing down.

This healthy and affordable activity is literally bringing in millions of dollars to the area particularly Queenstown.

Most travelling riders come to Queenstown specifically to ride mountain biking tracks in the Queenstown Bike Park and those developed by QMTBC. These trails are marketing themselves through online and print media.

Free trails and free media that bring in real money??!! Surely a dream come true for any council?!

QMTBC are grateful for \$7,500 current contribution to three of the club's areas and land use but would love to see the council get further involved in maintaining and enhancing the mountain bike trails and areas in Queenstown.

The success of the sport is outgrowing the club and the council need to realise the huge benefits for the town and invest in Queenstown's mountain biking future.

The club has the expertise and proven track record to create great trails that people love and combined with council funding we can control and expand Queenstown's riding areas to ensure locals and visitors want to keep coming back to ride and spend their dollars.

The QMTBC seek:

- Increasing the maintenance input to \$10,000 to include work on cross country trails. The QMTBC will at least match this contribution.
- Funding of new trail development. \$10,000 towards the construction of new trail in the Fernhill Loop area on QLDC land (full details available on request).
- Contribution towards the cost of QMTBC employing a part time secretary to undertake important club administration duties budget \$15,000 (full details available on request).
- A partnership with QLDC, QMTBC and other interested parties to provide world class facilities to match our world class image and further enhance our reputation as a global biking destination.

The QMTBC thank you for the opportunity to make this submission and look forward to working with QLDC to ensure Queenstown remains a 'must visit' for riders from all over the world. Please do not hesitate to contact the club for any further information should you require any.

Long live the loop



Mission

To save an iconic local favourite track for biking and walking by managing, maintaining and improving the user experience by adding well thought out access and new trail options.

Background

The Fernhill loop trail is a 6km multi use trail connecting Fernhill from Wynyard Crescent to the Midway Clearing in the Ben Lomond Forest.

The trail has 2 distinct sides - 'the Fernhill side' is very steep through broom, wilding pines and dense established pine forest and 'the Skyline side' which has a mellower gradient through some of Queenstown's only substantial surviving beech forest.

These two sides meet in a clearing at approximately 900m altitude with subalpine tussock and spectacular views of Queenstown, Lake Wakatipu and the Remarkables. This clearing is under threat of being taken over by invasive wilding pines.

The Skyline side through the beech forest is preferred by all walkers and bikers due to its gradient, natural singletrack and surrounding forest. It is regarded as one of the best pieces of mtb singletrack in Queenstown.

The Fernhill Side is unpopular due to its steep gradient, wide footprint, noxiuos vegetation and dense lifeless pine forest. For mountain bikers it is too steep to ride up and poor value as a descent as you are down too fast.

However this section is popular with trail runners.

The trail is officially closed following its handover from DoC to QLDC due to maintenance costs.

There are four structures (small bridges) built by DoC that require removal if no one steps up to manage the track. These structures are currently in good condition. DoC have offered that QMTBC take responsibility for them which QMTBC would only do with an agreement for the track.

Informal maintenance of the track is undertaken by volunteer mountain bikers from a passion for the track.

If the track remains closed it is in danger of falling into disrepair which would be a huge loss for local and visiting recreationalists.

What can be done

The QMTBC would like to manage the track and make some changes to make it more accessible and sustainable.

These include:

A Building an alternative climb to the clearings from the 'no mountain bikes' sign on the Ben Lomond Track. 1-2km handbuilt singeltrack. The current climb above 1mile creek is unclimbable but a great descent. The new climb would allow a loop entirely on the Skyline side and reducing any potential user conflict by creating a more directional loop rather than out and back. Walkers would also benefit from varying vistas and more trail in beech forest.

Land is QLDC/DOC

A Re-routing the Fernhill side. Approx 5km handbuilt singletrack. As stated before the Fernhill side is un-popular, high maintenance and un-sustainable. QMTBC would like to re-route from the clearing across the face of Ben Lomond and link onto the Arawata Terrace where walkers and bikers will have the option to return to Fernhill/town or continue towards existing tracks such as Gold Digger, 7mile recreation reserve and Moke Lake tracks.

The QMTBC would keep the existing trail open and maintain to a backcountry standard. DOC/Private Land. QMTBC have a management agreement with DOC and have a a verbal agreement with a private land owner.

Maintaining the trail and new additions. QMTBC have an impeccable track record for managing trails on DOC, QLDC and Private land. Using volunteers and paid contractors every trail that QMTBC builds (and other parties tracks) is maintained to a high standard.

Please see map for indicative trail routes.

Benefits

- A Providing world class recreation opportunities with a back country feel right from Queenstown centre.
- A Ensuring the potential of the Fernhill Loop is realised and the track does not disappear due to lack of maintenance and access.
- Providing for the significant number of mountain bikers and walkers that Queenstown attracts.
- A Providing better access to other tracks and creating a mre usable network.
- Knock on benefits for local businesses.
- Promoting cheap, healthy and fun activities that create a good community.

Methods

QMTBC are no stranger to lobbying for access and building tracks and we will follow the same procedures as usual. Consult landownders/managers. Develop management plans outlining any potential issues and forecasting ongoing maintenance. Building the track through volunteers or an experienced contractor to ensure sustainability to minimize ongoing costs. Providing informative signage.

The QMTBC plans to fundraise with a 'Long live the loop' campaign to include the local community and provide a sense of ownership. Details are to be finalised on the structure (we need permission first!).

As QLDC only manage land that would be used for the access climb connecting the Ben Lomond Track to then this document from here on focuses only on this section of trail.

Access climb

Description

- △ 2-3km singletrack (under 1m width) trail connecting the Ben Lomond walking track at the 'no mountain bikes' sign to the high point on fernhill loop.
- △ Starting elevation approx 800m, finishing elevation approx 1000m.
- ▲ Tussock and beech forest setting. Wilding pine infestation present.
- Serves as a climbable option to access fernhill loop
- Creates a loop entirely on Skyline side

Trail standards

The type of trail will be hand-built singletrack. Key characteristics of this style of trail are:

- Minimal impact on environment
- Aesthetically pleasing
- Under 1m width
- Sustainability built with frequent grade reversals to control erosion
- ▲ Native vegetation replanted where possible
- Sustainable mellow gradients to control erosion and biker speed.
- Suitable for walking and biking
- Natural style not extreme style with berms and gap jumps
- Wilding pine control will be carried out where affected
- All structures (if any) to adhere to QLDC structures standards

All trail work will comply with QMTBC trails standards document approved by DoC and QLDC.

Work will be carried out either by an expert trail building contractor or volunteers led and supervised by QMTBC and audited by a professional trailbuilder and QLDC.

User groups

QMTBC see the trail being suitable for mountain bikers and walkers with little user conflict. The existing fernhill loop sees both user groups use the trail together with few issues. The proposed trail is an uphill trail so speeds will be very low.

The new trail option will also create an anti-clockwise loop that will encourage all users to use the trail in the same direction that will reduce any potential user conflict.

The type of mountain biker who will use the trail will be a cross country rider who is very similar to a tramper. Their main goal is to get to beautiful places with an enjoyable trail experience and enjoy their surroundings.

The main age group will be late 20's upwards and the clothing style will be non threatening helmets (non full face) and often just technical shorts and t shirt.

Downhill type riders from the close by Queenstown Bike Park will **not** use this trail as it will have uphill riding that their bicycles and riding preferences will not suit.

Signage

Signage will be in QMTBC's standard providing information relevant to bikers and walkers. They will inform, trail grade, length and destination. Sign standard example:



Maintenance

QMTBC have a long history of a high level of maintenance throughout its areas. As this trail is designed to be a backcountry style experience maintenance needs will be quite minimal.

Maintenance tasks expected:

- clearing dead/wind fall
- inspecting drainage and ensuring correct operation
- water management
- Structure inspection and potential repair/replace

QMTBC will take on all maintenance tasks through a paid contractor, volunteer digs or a <u>trail adoptee</u>.


Moving forward

Table 7.3 identifies 71,575 attendee days per annum. Of these days approximately 46,000 are for
medium and large events. The balance of 25,000 attendee days are for small events .Say one third.

Howarth's study assumes that all conference activity is new. This would be a plausible 2. assumption for medium and large conferences as there are presently limited facilities in Queenstown. But for small events, one third of the total proposed new conference centre activity (25000 attendee days per annum) there are many existing facilities in Queenstown see Howath HTL table 5.1 Existing Conference Venues. 3. The Conference Centre would be in direct completion with existing venues for small events. The Howarth report provides no methodology on their assumption except that the existing providers would simply create 'new' business rather than compete for business. See 2nd para 7.1 Activity and Utilisation Projections Howarth HTL With at least a third of activity in direct competition with existing Queenstown report 4. venues this competition needs to be factored into the financial analysis of the new centre and into the general economic benefit analysis. 5. Queenstown has approximately 2,600,000 bed nights per annum. Howarth HTL report is projecting 70,000 additional attendee days per annum. This will only be a moderate increase of 2.7% to visitor number to the region. If competition from existing providers for small events was factored in the gain could be less than 2% over existing bed nights. 6. This is an underwhelming increase in visitor numbers for the substantial establishment expence, risk and ongoing cost of a new conference centre 7. To put into context the Winter games brought 37,786 international and 11,200 domestic bed nights to the region. A total of approximately 49,000 bed nights (ODT 12 Dec 2013). The Hills NZ Open Golf generated 34,000 bednights (ODT 24 March 2012) These two events generate more bed nights than an entire annual operation of the proposed conference centre. 8. On the basis of the Howarth HTL feasibility study the Convention centre simple does not bring enough additional visitors to Queenstown to warrant the \$52,000,000 expense. 9. QLDC should look at increasing funding for alternate events such as War Birds over Wanaka or Winter Games as these bring substantial visitors at much lower cost QLDC OPERATINGTHE CENTRE 10. Councils are not renowned for running commercial enterprise and it is hard to see QLDC having the experience or efficiency to own and run the Convention Centre. QLDC needs an experienced operator who is willing to make a capital contribution to the project. 11. If a commercial operator is not willing to step up to a highly subsidised, shared risk business then a convention centre is too higher risk for Council and our community to contemplate. COST 12. Queenstown has a small rate payer base and we have other large issues regarding Infrastructure that we need to pay for. A high cost convention centre and ongoing running costs are an additional burden to the community. LAKE VIEW SITE 13

Other comments: There are three major reasons that the Council should not proceed with the Convention Centre: 1. The cost to Ratepayers in terms of Capital, Operating Costs (optimistic 5 year projection) and Land total \$35.5 million based on what has been set out. This money could be much better used to improve infrastructure for residents and visitors or used to repay / avoid additional debt. When the original submission was made the figure was put at around \$5 million this is a huge risk for ratepayers which many are not aware of. Even in this draft plan you have to be financially savvy to put the numbers all together (and the funding source is debt at a very low interest rate). 2. Queenstown is in the centre of one of the most outstanding natural environments in the World. Any visitor you speak to always say "do not destroy what you have as it is unique in the world". That is the attraction of Queenstown - not Casinos, Convention Centres, Mass Tourism or the like. The focus should continue to be on providing that unique experience for individual travellers - particularly high end Tourism as has been successfully done in other parts of the world. We already have severe road constraints and bottlenecks in getting into and through Queenstown which cannot be remedied without damaging the natural beauty of the area. Ultimately for residents Queenstown will be like living in Auckland or other larger cities with traffic jams becoming more frequent and it taking longer to get to work, school drop offs etc and Tourists will also share the frustration. Then they will start marking down the desirability of holidaying here. 3. The Convention Centre will not add substantially to the local permanent employment pool as the ad hoc nature of conventions are such that they are big employers of casual labour - lower income roles which require much more low cost housing which has not been addressed. In the Hospitality Industry there is a well known saying that the first owner goes bust, the second owner gets out with nothing and the third owner makes the money (after the asset has been heavily discounted).

The Council proposes that the entire Lakeview site be developed to accommodate the convention centre, hot pools (Ngai Tahu) and other developments on the remaining land. Do you support this development of the site? **No**



Other comments: Being a relatively new Ratepayer in the area I may be incorrect in my understanding. That understanding was that this land was earmarked for a by-pass road and some low cost housing. How do the traffic issues get resolved without this land?

Other comments: I fail to see the benefit to average Ratepayers. Minimal additional full time employment. Construction jobs will have to be imported as there will be competition with Christchurch and the developments on Frankton Flats - all this will just push housing costs in the area even higher. Start monitoring the number of employees in the area who now live in Cromwell and Wanaka as they cannot afford to live in Queenstown (even after paying the high transport costs to commute each day to work in Queenstown). So how can additional low paid jobs help the area in improving the local economy if they live elsewhere. If the Convention Centre is to fill existing hotels etc. in the area then the current growth in tourism should do that unless the operators have a poor product. Bottom-line is that there is no benefit for the average Residential Ratepayer - they will benefit to a greater extent economically from that money being used to retire debt and/or in improving infrastructure. You will increase the rates of the average residential ratepayer for at least five years but where is the corresponding credit to their personal profit and loss as opposed to the Commercial Ratepayers. If it is of National importance then the National Government can fund it at the expense of all New Zealand Taxpayers. If it is of commercial importance and value then commercial interests (either locally or otherwise) can fund this. Council's role is to facilitate business not underwrite it - throughout the World governments are selling off commercial assets as they realise their role is not to be involved in commercial undertakings.

Other comments: Water metering for information maybe but not for a user pays system. To identify large users, leaking pipes etc it is fine but user pays will inevitably lead to adverse consequences. Having lived in two large Australian Cities when "User Pays" was introduced for water consumption I have seen what actual human behaviour can do to what looks like a perfectly reasonable and logical solution. The worst outcome was Sydney where the fall in usage (greater than 20% over 3-4 years) was such that the water utilities had to pass on double digit price increases 3 years in a row as they discovered water distribution was primarily a fixed charge and it only became a variable charge when you had to build the next water storage and pumping facility. The 20% reduction was principally residential and arose through behaviours such as not watering nature strips (Council land), the paving industry experienced double digit growth for several years as residents chose hard landscaping, more water tanks being installed in residential areas after Council planning requirements were over ruled by the State Govt, and some positive reaction to an education program on wise water usage principles. Unfortunately reduction in usage by large water users and the target reduction in water loss through leaky pipework did not occur so overall the average person felt cheated - paid more to use less and they paid for a Desalination plant on top of that. Incidentally our water usage, water fixed rates, storm-water (none where we live now), and sewerage (we are on Septic here) was less than we pay for water only in Queenstown (economies of scale I assume).

Being able to sign up for a regular (monthly?) email from the CEO or Mayor (or both) where all important issues are briefly listed so that if any interest the Ratepayer they can then go onto the Council website to get further information. There could be listed bylaw changes, infrastructure projects needing consideration or whatever else the CEO / Mayor consider should at least be advised to Ratepayers so that they are fully informed and can contact an appropriate Councillor or whatever if they have firm views on a particular subject. You could even attach the



Council minutes to the email - it saves time poor people from remembering to go onto the QLDC site every few days and then trying to find anything that they may be interested in.

Comments: Annual Plan Submission QLDC 2014 Community Engagement CCS Disability Action and the Queenstown Disability Resource Centre facilitate the Wakatipu Access Group. This has been an excellent way of engaging with the community to promote a region that is accessible for all people. We would like to thank the council for supporting this group and being pre-active in ensuring Mobility Parking enables disabled people to access the community. CCS Disability Action shares the vision of the New Zealand Disability Strategy and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of People with Disabilities, that disabled people have the same right to take part in community life as everyone else. CCS Disability Action would like to the QLDC to have a Disability Strategy to ensure that it is responsive to the needs of its disability community, like the other councils around New Zealand. As Queenstown grows and develops it will need to meet the needs of its diverse community. It is estimated that one in five people experience some form of impairment. We would like to see the council adopt the Life Time design in building projects to ensure universal and accessible design principles are applied in any new building developments in the district. A developers' Disability Access Code would be very useful for projects such as the Five Mile Development to ensure they are planning good access that follows the principles of the



Accessible Journey. Rather than focusing on the minimum the Disability Access Code would be committed to providing full access. This needs be ensured at the planning stage. For example, if automatic doors were put into the Lakes Leisure Complex when it was built rather than identifiying the need now, this would have saved a lot of money and time. I note that after requesting through the annual planning process for over fours year for automatic doors to provide easy access to this important community facility this is now planned for this financial year. For example Remarkables Park shopping complex meets its quota of Mobility Parks by having three parks in the back gravel car park that provide access to the shrubbery not shops. We would also like to see the council include disability responsiveness training for its employees to improve staff awareness and responsiveness to the needs of disabled and aging persons. This is particularly important as the council plans for the region?s future growth. It is excellent that the Lakes Leisure staff are taking advantage of the Disability Responsiveness workshops this month offered by the Queenstown Disability Resource Centre (funded through the Think Differently funding). CCS Disability Action would like to thank the council for improving the access to the Gardens Playground. It is important that people can participate and contribute in the community. We would like to see a policy in place that requires all council funded events to have provided disability access to ensure the inclusion of disabled people in our community. For example at this year?s Autumn festival we requested that mobility parking not be down the hill towards the river but near the museum so people can access this event. Participation in events also includes seating, hearing loops and considering the Accessible Journey i.e. how people get from the car park to the event. Queenstown is considered to be the adventure and tourism capital. We would also like to see the promotion of accessible tourism in the district, again promoting the region inclusive to all people. For example encouraging websites to include access information. I am delighted to see at last the improved access to the Frankton Trail and look forward to test driving the new Gibbston River Trail upgrade as before this there were no accessible trails in the Wakatipu basin for disabled people. Getting around our community is important for all people. CCS Disability Action believes that disabled people should be able to move freely and easily around their communities. The Queenstown area is made up of many separate communities that requires people to travel, in some cases a significant distance to get to work, go to the supermarket, get medical care and other aspects of daily living. This means for disabled people who are not able to drive using the Total Mobility Service is very expensive to get from Arrowtown to Frankton for example. There needs to be the option of an accessible bus service. We would like the council to have a policy of updating bus stops to make sure there is a footpath so the accessible buses can eventually service this region. If the council is serious about the inclusion of disabled people they need some strong policies to make this happen.

The KPCA also asks if consideration could be made to council contributing to the installation of a mow strip around two sides of the new community funded multi sport facility at Jardine Park. During the meeting to hand this facility over to QLDC's parks and reserves department for maintenance, the QLDC staff in attendance described the difficulty in mowing the area adjacent to the courts due to the lack of a mow strip and the presence of multiple small rocks in this area which could create a health and safety hazard to the mower operator, the general public, and the adjacent facilities (including the Wakatipu Croquet Club). Quotes have been requested from contractors for this work, with a price of \$4,682.35 + GST received from Fulton Hogan Ltd - further quotes can be requested if necessary but this provides an indication of the cost involved. Comments: RE: Mixed Used Rates for properties used partially for Visitor Accommodation I recently became aware, through the QLDC publicity of the amnesty around providing short-term visitor accommodation, of the need to register my property as a holiday home with the QLDC. This has meant that my rates are now approximately 25% higher and deemed mixed use, costing an additional \$500 per annum. ? My understanding of the reasoning for this is that this type of accommodation benefits from the promotional and marketing efforts of the area, and therefore should contribute to this cost. I would like to propose that there be some further consideration of these QLDC policies to allow further variation in the mixed used rates presently charged. I can best illustrate this by providing more information of how the finances work for my family. I am a single mother with two children aged 10 and 7 years. I have a mortgage and pay rates. I periodically rent the house that we all live in to holiday makers. The closets all have dead bolts and personal items are locked away. We vacate our home when it is rented in holiday periods. The two kids and myself either go away during school holidays to visit family, or we camp. I do this because I cannot afford not to. This additional income means that I can just afford to live here. Without this income,



I would not be able to pay all of my bills. Last year I rented the house for 32 days total and earned \$7,625 which is all declared on my taxes with associated expenses. The prior year I rented the house for 35 days and earned \$5,279. Based on these numbers, the QLDC would like take 6.6 to 9.5% of my gross income from short-term visitor accommodation, before expenses, in additional rates for this activity. I think that this is excessive. My suggestion is that the Council consider what is a fair amount to pay relative to full time accommodation rates. I doubt that hotels are paying anything near 6.6-9.5% of their gross earnings to the QLDC in rates. When the property is only rented 32-35 days a year, this is only 9-10% of the number of days in the year (35/365 days). But I pay mix used rate on 90 days or 25%. I doubt very much that low income families like myself are able to rent the home that they live in for 90 days per annum. It's just not practical. So why are our mixed rates based on 90 days? This is perhaps why the amount seems excessive. Can the 25% be scaled in smaller increments perhaps to address this? Further, given my situation, I think that there should be some acknowledgement that living in the QLDC is an expensive lifestyle. In order to raise children here, families like ourselves actually have to rent out homes a little in order to even afford the rates, before mixed use rates. Affordable housing is an issue that the Council is aware of. Perhaps some distinction should be made for families in my situation who actually live in the home that they rent and who just vacate it for short periods of time. Perhaps if this it the primary residence, some exemptions should be made? It is away of allowing families to address their affordable housing issues and it is a way that the QLDC can do the same. This is quite a different situation to houses which are vacant, or second homes which are used also for short term visitor accommodation. These are two suggestions on changing this unfairness while also helping young families in the QLDC with affordable housing. As it is, I don't believe the visitor accommodation policies have been thought through well enough by the QLDC. I think my case is a good example of how it does not work well. It is a lot of work to prepare a home that you live in for visitors. Now, having to pay the QLDC a significant cut in the income feels very unfair. It is making things harder for young families, rather than helping them. Perhaps this policy did not consider this scenario when it was made. It's not too late now to give it some further consideration and review. I sincerely hope that you do. Young families need all the help that they can get living here. I believe the QLDC thinks the same way

The Trustees and Youth Workers from the Wakatipu Youth Trust would first like to thank the QLDC for the continued support of our organisation. From the annual donation to help with rent costs, representation by staff on the board, the provision of resources and the management of grants such as the Creative Communities Scheme, the Trust acknowledges and appreciates the numerous ways in which the Council is able to support the Trust in delivering a top notch youth service for the Wakatipu area. The Trust, since merging As you may be aware, three years ago the Trust merged the Wakatipu District Youth Trust and the Queenstown Life Trust and formed the Wakatipu Youth Trust. There are now four Youth Workers, one of whom is the Team Leader. The capability and productivity of the Trust has greatly improved since merging and the numbers attending the youth centre have nearly tripled in this time. Please take a look at the enclosed summary of the extensive number of initiatives and attendances for each for the 2013 calendar year. This is an indication of the Trust's ability to connect with the young people and engage them in projects that they value and want. All initiatives are evaluated against national frameworks for successful outcomes with youth. The



Trust has gone from strength to strength and is now strategically positioned with skilled staff, a renovated youth centre and strong relationships to the community, both to other agencies and business networks. There are over fifty businesses that contribute goods, services and donations to the youth projects. Our request Our request, through this submission to the Annual Plan, is for the Council to increase it's annual donation to the Trust from \$15, 160 (50% of the rent cost) to \$30,320 - (100% of the rent cost). After merging, the Trust submitted to the Annual Plan to ask for just 50% of the rent cost. At that time, it was anticipated that funding agencies and sources of donations would continue as they had done in the pre-merger trusts. The Trust anticipated that a donation of just 50% of the rent would enable the trust's budget to be sustainable and that it did not need more than this. However, since merging, some of the key sources of funding reduced their grant to the new trust, perceiving that merging should enable cost savings. They did not consider the population growth in the area. Nor did they consider that merging would enable greater capability and reach in meeting the interests and needs of an increasing number of youth. The Trust has grown since merging - beyond the sum of the two pre-merger trusts. This has increased costs, not reduced them. Further, with now four staff under one roof, it became quickly apparently that one staff member needed to take on the role of coordination and management of the team, increasing the cost of salaries. This also gave rise to the need for office space to be rented above the youth centre to house the team, at additional cost. The decrease in funding and increase in costs has created a large divide in meeting the \$260,000 annual budget, two years in a row. The Trust cannot sustain this beyond this point as the reserves are running out. The Trust has to receive more funding or cut back on staff. Appeals have been made to Lottery Grants, Central Lakes Trust and the Community Trust of Southland. The Trust also appeals to the QLDC to assist the Trust's financial needs. The Trust is very reluctant to let go of any of the valuable staff, especially when the population of youth is growing and the number accessing the service is rapidly growing. They are a highly successful team. Please read the numerous letters of support of their initiatives enclosed. It would be particularly disheartening to the young people in Glenorchy to lose a Youth Worker, because they have very little services available to them due to their remoteness. Our appeals for more assistance have been met so far. This year, Lottery grants have provided an additional \$5,000 per annum and the Central Lakes Trust an additional \$3,750. We will hear from the Community Trust of Southland later this month. With these top ups and if the Council could cover the cost of the rent, the Trust would be financially sustainable. The Council would be assured that there are highly skilled Youth Workers in the Wakatipu district, trained in creating and enhancing opportunities that engage and support a high number of young people to take up challenges. Through investing in our young people and providing certain conditions that give them more opportunities to thrive, this ultimately leads to young people feeling a greater sense of belonging in their community as well as making a positive contribution to the future of the Wakatipu. 



To whom it may concern,

This is a letter of support for the Youth Booth, a highry valued and much needed service for the young people in the Wakatipu Community.

The Wakatipu community is often misrepresented as an affluent population and statistically we have right employment rates which could mean that families are well provided for financially. However the reakty is that the basic costs of accommodation, food and electricity are high here and wages particularly in the hospitality sector are low. Many parents are working long hours to provide their family with the basics and in a town that operates *T* days a week this can mean that many of our young people are left to their own devices while parents work. With 83% of the people in our community having moved here from elsewhere in either New Zealand or around the world many of these families have no extended family support that they can call on. This impacts on families from a day to day practical viewpoint in that there are no Grandparents/ Uncles around to keep an eye on or spend time with the young people but it also means that in times of crisis there is little or no support. The transient nature of our community means that it is very hard to make and maintain friends here as people are often move on out of the district when they realise the true cost of living here.

The Youth Booth provide a much needed, unique service to our young people by providing them with a safe, caring environment in the form of a drop in centre as well as organised activities, interest groups and holiday programmes. The social and educational work that the Youth Workers take in to the local schools is also an important aspect, as is the leadership and healthy adult role modelling that takes place when the staff and solunteers interact with the young people.

Supporting Families work collaboratively with the Youth Booth from time to time and often refer young beople to the centre, in transient communities such as ours the fact that they have maintained such highly capable and initialisatic staff is a credit to the organisation; we would not hesitate to recommend the service to a family that we are supporting.

Comments: Provision of \$210,000 for ?Atley Road Extension? was made in the 2012/13 annual plan. It has since been carried forward to subsequent financial years. I believe it should not be carried over for the following reason: This provision is for the sole benefit of one developer, Larchmont Developments and is opposed by the existing users of the road. In a council meeting 12th April 2012 agenda item 6, two options were considered for access to an area of Low Density Residential land that was looking to be developed by Larchmont Developments. The two options were discussed and an "Evaluation Summary' was included in the report from Denis Mander. The simpler option, through Matthias Tce, was going to require no funding from the council. The Resource Consents attached to this was under appeal to Environment Court and the potential cost to council was in the order of \$6000. The second option of extending Atley Road to include an existing narrow access way, was also considered. As listed in the 'Evaluation Summary' the road does not meet council standards, unlike the Matthias Tce option, and would require council funding assistance. This would end up being \$210,000 in contributions, some of which is help as a covenant over a neighbours land (presently rural general). It has been identified in the conditions RM 130844 of the Resource Consent for the subdivision that if the owner (of the land that has a



covenant over it) wants to subdivide then they will have to 'resolve' the pinch point (of the one way section) which would require purchasing of private land. This has not been possible for the Larchmont developer and would probably not be possible for any future developer therefore stymieing any further development and creating a 'land locked' situation. The council would then be supporting a solution for the sole benefit of one developer, who had multiple chances at times he has subdivided other land to solve the solution but has not taken them, to the safety detriment of the users and further development. If all future developments accessed through Matthias Tce, then they would be onto roads of council standards. This is the option the council should be funding. There has been marked opposition to the Atley Road extension proposal from the existing users of the road, for various reasons including: - safety concerns regarding a narrow oneway section of road located by a corner with very limited sight lines and where a right of way accessing 6 houses connects onto the access way. - removal or potential interference and shadowing of existing vegetation due to a 2m + proposed retaining wall along NE boundaries. The retaining walls are also out of scale and character for area - insufficient road design to be able to evaluate the sightlines and no information from the developer. - the road does not fully meet council standards, and where it is most dangerous, on the corner with a steep bank one side and a drop off on the other, it is the least complying. The reason for this is not only geographical but also ownership - there is not enough room available in the existing access way.
There has been constant expression of concern from the residents at council meetings and Resource Consent hearings but none of the concerns have been addressed and solutions found. I believe council is mistaken in supporting a roading solution that does not meet the council standards when there is a solution that does. Now that there is two Resource Consents for different access options for the development, council should reconsider its contribution and support the option that benefits the community the most, does not incurring public funding and does not create a less safe community.

"Please give serious consideration to funding \$1,514-40 being 20% of the administration costs for Central Otago Health Incorporated (COHInc)." The total administration costs of COHInc are \$7,572. Of this amount Central Otago District Council (CODC) pays \$7,100. It has been felt for a number of years that Queenstown Lakes District Council (QLDC) should have been paying their share of the cost for the administration of COHInc. The Dunstan Hospital is owned by the Southern District Health Board (SDHB). COHInc provides the link between Dunstan Hospital and the communities served by the hospital and represents the interests of those communities. COHInc owns and funds the furniture fittings and equipment within the hospital and protects those assets on behalf of the community. COHInc elects the Directors of Central Otago Health Services Limited (COHSL), who are responsible for the day to day running of the hospital and are funded by the SDHB. COHInc owns the shares of COHSL on behalf of the community. COHInc members are elected at the triennial local body elections and have been reliant on the good will of CODC who have been paying almost all of the administration costs for COHInc. There are 5 members elected to the COHInc Board of which one is from the



Wanaka Ward of QLDC, hence the request for 20% of the funding. There is a long history of involvement with the Wanaka Ward and Dunstan Hospital. In 1998 the transition Shareholders of Central Otago Health were, CODC Mayor Bill McIntosh, Wanaka Community Board Chairman, Peter Barrow, and Alexandra lawyer, Darryl Fletcher. ?1 April 1999. Central Otago Health shareholders, Bill, Peter, and Darryl along with Chris Crane (representing the Health Funding Authority) signed a Heads of Agreement which paved the way for a final contract providing community responsibility for the delivery of health services from Dunstan hospital to begin 1 July 1999.? CT scans, specialist appointments and chemotherapy treatments are provided for the entire Central Otago region including Queenstown. We request that QLDC fund 20% of the administration costs of Central Otago Health Incorporated.

Increasing numbers are attending forums and an increasingly wide demographic are becoming involved. This can be demonstrated by comparing the names of people attending forums. Of the 75 who attended the recent Conservation Forum in Wanaka, less than 10 would have also attended the Visitor and Tourism Forum in either Queenstown or Wanaka (165 people in total attended the V&T Forum). A similar comparison can be made between the Innovation Forum (Wanaka) and the Economic Futures Forum (Wanaka and Queenstown) and between the Innovation Forum attendees and those who attended the Conservation Forum. We have 50 signed up paid up members ? 8 are corporate - plus 350 people signed up to our newsletter. Our target is 1000 paid up members by 1 July 2016, including 100 corporates. Money from the QLDC grant is used to pay coordination and administration costs plus direct Forum and Speaker Series costs. Other costs include maintaining www.shapingourfuture.org.nz and producing our annual progress report. We are a lean organisation run by a volunteer Steering Group. We do not pay meeting expenses using either Council facilities or donated boardrooms for meetings and always buy our own coffees! We do provide tea coffee and minimal food at forums that are held in the evening. Shaping Our Future now has six forums established that will continue to provide feedback to the community and its agencies for the foreseeable future. The Steering Group envisages a ?sinking lid? policy regarding its current Council funding and will present a plan for reducing the grant level over the next five years in its next report. This will cover corporate membership, alternative funding bodies and sponsorship. Governance Shaping Our Future is an incorporated society with tax exemption. It is guided by an annually elected volunteer Steering Group. Pete Bullen, David Kennedy (chair), Alastair Porter, Celia Crosbie, Jim Boult, Prue Kane, Trent Yeo, Ralph Hanan, Ed Taylor. Four live in Wanaka/Hawea and five in Queenstown. A new Steering Group will be elected at the Annual General Meeting scheduled for November. Coordination is currently contracted through the Centre for Sustainable Practice. This arrangement is likely to come to an end at June 30 2014 and it?s proposed that a private contractor be sought with the Centre contracted as and when required. Financials: Shaping Our Future has been granted \$50,000 for the year ended June 30, 2014. This money has been committed in the following way: \$33,000 for coordination services ? support and administration \$6,000 Visitor and Tourism Forum \$5,000 Conservation, Energy and Innovation Forums for Queenstown and Wanaka, Speaker series events \$6,000 Annual General Meeting, Annual progress report, website maintenance This budget will be fully spent by December 2014 (again reflecting a six month delay in MOU establishment) Shaping Our Future has also raised \$2600 through membership fees and donations. Forums established over the past year: Visitor and Tourism, Innovation, Conservation. We envisage all three plus one other (yet to be determined, but planning is underway for an Education Forum) will be at the stage of delivering a report to appropriate agencies by June 30, 2015. At this point, Shaping Our Future will have caught up with its obligations under the MOU (2 Forums per year at stage of report delivery). Full Forum update: Events ? first round of recommendations complete. In response to that Task Force report, an Events Office and funding regime has been established. First public reports filed. In the Shaping Our Future process at some future point (expected to be around March 2015) this new baseline will be established, a forum convened and, if required, a new task force established to measure progress against vision, re-establish vision if required and new recommendations made if required. I fully support the development of a hot pool precinct by Ngai Tahu but believe the balance of the land should be retained until these are built and a clearer picture of what may be compatible and best benefit these two facilities to give the greatest return. I know nothing about the way the rates table are worked out but because of the potential benefits to the district as a whole it seems reasonable that the rate charges would be spread over the whole district. I live in Wanaka and can only comment on what impact I believe the rate rise will have on Wanaka residents and commercial operators. The two rate changes I question are these. The whole Queenstown commercial, and accommodation areas, whether in the CBD or not, stand to benefit substantially from the building of the Convention Centre as opposed to the benefit to Wanaka operators. As I read it, It therefore seems an anomaly that in the first year the projected rates increase for Wanaka commercial - low will be 5.6% when the Queenstown commercial - low will be 4.9%. Is this a mistake.? Also in the first year the rate change of a 6.1% increase to the Wanaka accommodation - high providers, as against the Queenstown accommodation -high of 6.5% does not seem to be in proportion to the benefits that Queenstown operators will gain.

Comments: Parking in Wanaka More buildings are being constructed in the Wanaka CBD yet once again there are no plans in the Annual Draft Plan to address the lack of parking in the Wanaka CBD, This has been an issue which will not go away until it has been addressed. Why is it being ignored when the viability of the Wanaka businesses and therefore the town, is dependent on parking.? Council have the ability to put a time limit on the Dungarvon Street car park to encourage turnover but this still remains unrestricted. Without any mention of purchasing land for more parking, it would seem a car park building built in stages on either the Dunmore Street car park or the car park behind the fire station is one answer. Is this something Council would consider or enter into an agreement along with private enterprise.? If not what plans are there to address the parking for our town.? Wanaka Airport I Queenstown Airport The report in the Annual Plan stated that the Wanaka Airport runway can now be lengthened because the noise boundaries have been extended. It seems a very sad state of affairs when some residential areas close to the Queenstown Airport are so affected by the noise from the Queenstown Airport that their homes are to be insulated and some, possibly having mechanical ventilation installed. The mountainous terrain also contributes to the fact that sometimes flights have to be diverted because of bad weather, poor visibility etc. Surely it is time to recognise that plans could be speeded up so that the Wanaka Airport could play a very significant role by providing commercial flights in and out of the area. This would be of benefit to the whole district. Wanaka Cemetery (Pembroke) The Annual Plan acknowledges that all cemeteries in the district are of major historical importance. In Wanaka the original Pembroke part of the cemetery is now closed but many graves are in dire need of repair and tidying up. When I enquired about some funding to help with this work I was told the graves belong to the families and no funds were available. Some of these graves date from the late 1800's /early 1900s and some of those buried here have played a significant role in the early days of Wanaka (Pembroke) and their descendants are now well gone. The Council keep the cemetery surrounds neat and tidy and it is very upsetting to see the old graves neglected. The Friends of Pembroke Cemetery have been trying for 3 years to get funding to get this work done. We have had offers from different local businesses to supply labour and some materials free of charge and any Council funds to upgrade some of these graves would be appreciated. My concern is the matter of Brownston Street and I wish to have this included in the Annual Plan as I consider it a matter of great importance for the town. When the 2012/2013 Council attempt to provide parks on Pembroke Park in return for strips of road reserve being added to the Pembroke Park area was turned down, submissions highlighted - ? The neglected state of Brownston Street, with no seal to the edge of the street, water ponding on the road verge plus mud and ruts. ? folly in using angle parking on a through street when NZ Transport studies reported there are more accidents with angle parking as opposed to parallel parking,? The fact there is ample width to have parallel parking on both sides of the street if the seal went to the boundary of Pembroke Park. ? Plans were presented from a local surveying firm showing the number of parallel parks that were able to be constructed on Brownston Street even with generous spaces.?

The entrance of the Wanaka Lakeview Holiday Park is on Brownston Street and large campervans, cars with caravans and cars with boats etc are part and parcel of a holiday camp. Restricting parking to one side of the street and having angle parking the only option would not be visitors friendly in fact it would be a nightmare for some and I believe it would disadvantage the Holiday Park and the town. Holiday makers need space to park to go to the shops etc. With



parallel parking on Brownston Street they can do this but with angle parking they could not. ? The intersections of Brownston and Dungarvon Streets, and Brownston and McDougall Streets have had excessive grassed verges planted coming right to the edge of the road. When parking is seemingly a priority in Wanaka there is no justification for this amount of grassed area to be classed as needed for 'visibility' at the corners. I hope common sense will prevail and that Brownston Street will be sealed to the post and chain boundary of Pembroke Park, and parallel parking will be marked on both sides of the street so that traffic for locals and visitors can flow freely.

properly. There are also a number of ads and films shot in this area, and faster broadband would also help those productions companies, Discovery Channel filming in Wanaka recently was a prime example of this were they were unable to complete post-production editing, which was moved offshore to be completed when it could and should have been done in Wanaka.
